For now, we are trying to maintain business as usual and keep disruption to our children's learning to a minimum, whilst playing our part in preventing the spread of infection.

The focus on hygiene continues, with regular, rigorous handwashing and regular cleaning of the school, targeting key areas multiple times throughout the day.

A planned KS2 visit to Perry Wood Care Home on 27<sup>th</sup> March, as part of our service project, will be postponed for the protection of all. There are no other trips scheduled before the Easter holidays.

We have also decided to postpone the KS1 Sharing Assembly that was scheduled for next Friday morning at 9am, the EYFS Community Coffee and Cake Session and the Values Workshop that were scheduled for Friday 27<sup>th</sup> March due to the fact that we cannot predict what the situation will be by this point. We would rather go ahead with these important and special events under more certain circumstances, so that they can be enjoyed by all. New dates will be provided in due course.

There are currently no plans to do so, but should the school have to close due to government direction at any point, plans are in place to be able to provide a range of home learning opportunities. We will of course keep you informed about any developments.
