

Maths: Number

Using numbers 1 -20. Counting reliably and recognising numerals 1 to 20. Counting and selecting correct numerals. Counting actions or objects which cannot be moved. Place numbers in order and say which number is one more or one less than a given number. Using quantities and objects to add and subtract and count on and back to find their answers. Children will understand subitising and be able to explain and demonstrate this; adding, subtracting and estimating.

Title of Unit of Enquiry:

Ticket to Ride

English:

Phonics: Consolidate ALL phase 2 and 3 phonemes and tricky words.

Reading: segment and blend to read accurately out loud, recognising high frequency and common irregular words.

Writing: write words in ways which match their spoken sounds. Write some irregular common words. Write sentences which can be read by themselves and others.

Expressive Arts & Design:

Sing songs, make music and dance and experiment with ways of changing them.

Represent own ideas, thoughts and feelings through design and technology, art, music, dance, role play and stories.

Music: Big Bear Funk!

Listen and appraise a different piece of Funk music each session

Explore and create using voices and classroom instruments

Sing and Play Big Bear Funk and revisit a selection of nursery rhymes and action songs

Drivers:

Understanding the world:

Know about similarities and differences between themselves and others and among families, communities and traditions.

Talk about the features of our own immediate environment and how environments might vary from one another.

Communication & Language:

Listen to stories, accurately anticipating key events and respond to what they hear with relevant comments, questions or actions.

Follow instructions involving several ideas
Express themselves effectively, showing awareness of the listeners' needs

Physical development: Ball Skills

Children will develop fundamental ball skills such as rolling and receiving a ball, throwing to a target, bouncing and catching, dribbling with feet and kicking a ball. Children will be able to develop their fine and gross motor skills through a range of game play using a variety of equipment. Children will be given opportunities to work independently and with a partner.

Science: Forces

Discovering pushes and pulls.
How do things move? How do we move?
What words can we use to describe these movements?

PSE: HeartSmart – Fake is a Mistake (I tell the truth)

Talking about, and demonstrating the importance of telling the truth.

RE: Which places are important?

Focusing on Christians and Muslims. Exploring Jewish and Hindu places of Worship too.
