

Maths: Shape, space and measures

Continuing with money – using money in play, beginning to recognise 1p, 2p and 5p coins. Pricing items and buying in role play.

Talking about positions of objects such as 'behind' and 'next to'
Ordering items in by length and height – biggest to smallest.

Continuing with numbers and the number system.

Title of Unit of Enquiry: Superheroes

Phonics: Continuation of daily phonics sessions -Phase 1 phonics including;
Environmental sounds.
Instrumental sounds.
Body percussion (e.g. clapping and stamping)
Rhythm and rhyme. Following a rhyming string.
Alliteration.
Voice sounds.
Initial sounds.
Oral blending and segmenting (e.g. hearing that d-o-g makes 'dog')

Expressive Arts & Design:

Exploring and using media and materials:
Looking at instruments and the different sounds we can make. Sing songs, make music and dance! Action rhymes.

Create simple representations of events, people and objects.

Music: Everyone!

Listen and Respond to a different style of music each week

Explore and Create - initially using voices only but building to using classroom instruments too

Sing and play - nursery rhymes and action songs - building to singing and playing

Share and Perform

Science: Superhero science!

Explores the meaning and sounds of new words
Introduces a storyline or narrative into their play

PSE: Don't forget to let love in

Children learn that each one of us is loved, special and important.

RE: Being special: Where do we belong?

This unit plan focuses on Christianity, Hinduism and Islam.
The children will begin to recognise the Christian belief that God loves and knows all people. They will talk about how babies are welcomed in the Muslim tradition.
They will recall simply what happens at a traditional Christian infant baptism.

Physical development:

In this unit, children will develop their expressive movement through the topic of 'places'. Children explore space and how to use space safely. They explore traveling actions, shapes and balances. Children choose their own actions in response to a stimulus. They are also given the opportunity to copy, repeat and remember actions. They continue to use counting to help them keep in time with the music. They explore dance through the world around them. They perform to others and begin to provide simple feedback.
