KSI SWIMMING PROVISION

Dear Parents/Carers,

Please read the following to your child:

The following guidance must be adhered to. This will help protect the wearer and other children from any accidents:-

SAFE CHOICE

There is a British Standard for manufacturers. Buy either these or a well-known brand name.

Avoid cheap and easily splintered goggles. Check that the rims are well padded and there are no rough edges.

SAFE USE

Before use, rinse goggles in the pool. This helps to prevent 'misting up'. If in use they fill with water or mist up, remove them completely to clear. To remove goggles ONLY push them up and then off the top of the head. NEVER pull goggles forward or them mayfly back and cause serious eye injury.

WHEN NOT IN USE

Do not use goggles in a crowded pool. Even under normal use goggles may lead to collisions with the poolside or with other swimmers. Do not use goggles when diving- Even plunging in from the poolside wearing goggles should be restricted to expert competitive swimmers.

REMEMBER

- Accidents are caused by people who do not know the dangers of using goggles incorrectly. NEVER pull goggles away from your eyes. NEVER interfere with goggles worn by someone else.
- Whereas teachers will continue to maintain their vigilance and ensure that strict safety precautions are in operation any accident that occurs through the child not following the correct procedure as applied to swimming goggles must be the responsibility of that child.
